

Certified Teacher Training in the F. M. Alexander Technique

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Schedule & Course Fees

Teacher trainees complete a total of 1600 hours over three or more years in accordance with the *American Society for the Alexander Technique (AmSAT) Bylaws and Teacher Certification Requirements*.

Daily Schedule

The course meets 9:00 – 12:00; Tuesday – Friday mornings for 43 weeks per year. Additional Mondays offered periodically throughout the year.

Class Structure

9:00–10:00	Chair and/or Table ‘Turns’
10:00–10:45	Game/Procedure of the Week
10:45–11:30	Break + Reading/DVD/Paper/Report
11:30–12:00	Q&A/Review/Journal/Application

Yearly Schedule (approximate)

- Ten weeks from early January – mid-March.
- Ten weeks from end of March – early June.
- Ten weeks from mid-June – late August
- Thirteen weeks from mid-September – mid-December.
- Fifteen additional hours of lessons, class, other.

Time Off

- One week in the early Spring.
- Two weeks in early Summer.
- Two weeks in late Summer.
- One week for Thanksgiving
- Three weeks for Winter Holidays.

Training Fees

2018 training year is 43 weeks @ \$37/day = \$6364.*

- Five lessons/year with Director.
- Private lessons are \$50/each.
- Additional ten hours/year of class, lessons, other.
- Textbooks, copies, and field trips are trainee expenses.

*A 3% cost-of-living increase is applied in January each year.

Independent Study

When needed, Independent study (up to 10% of the total hours; 160 hours) is at the discretion of the Director.

Third Year Trainees

- Work alongside the Director for class chair turns.
- Give turns to fellow trainees.
- Teach practice students.
- Attend practice lessons with the Director.
- Create a promotional piece.
- Assist with public demonstrations/classes.

Training Course Policies & Enrollment Agreement

Payment/Refund/Trial Period

Once enrolled, payment is due at the beginning of each session. Trainees withdrawing prior to the start of the session will receive a full refund. Trainees withdrawing after the first week of a session will not be refunded except in cases of personal emergency or in agreement with the Director. The first session of training is considered a trial period for both the trainee and the Director.

Absence

Notification by email or phone prior to class is requested when a trainee will be absent for the day. Absences beyond a total of ten per year must be made up through additional attendance on the training course, additional private lessons, and/or Independent Study. Additional training hours and private lessons are at the trainee's expense. A one session leave of absence is allowed, if the trainee's personal circumstances warrant it.

Evaluation/Conduct/Dismissal

Trainees will receive a verbal evaluation of their progress at each session's private lesson. Breaches in conduct that affect the operation of the training course, or that call into question a trainee's ability to responsibly teach the Technique on a professional basis, will be addressed privately. Dismissal is seen as a last resort.

Certification

Certification is given once 1600 hours of training is completed to the satisfaction of the Director. In the event that a trainee does not meet the level of proficiency required, further study will be arranged between the Director and the trainee prior to the second session of the third year of training. If any additional training is required, it will be at the trainee's expense. Teacher trainees are not to present themselves as teachers of the Alexander Technique until they have received written certification.

He is an active member of *AmSAT*, having served as Chair and Board member.
